Gonzalez Convention Center. Students heard a message from keynote speaker, Sherry Winn, a two-time Olympian and national championship basketball coach. The national officer candidates gave their campaign speeches at the close of the session.

Sunday, students participated in these competitive events: Sydney Atkinson, Heather Atkinson, and Elsie Magwire – Community Service Project; Joseph Hiatt and Elsie Magwire – Business Plan; Heather Atkinson and Lauryn Hoffman – Business Financial Plan; Sydney Atkinson – Spreadsheet Applications; Joshua Kersch – Introduction to Financial Math; Trevor Goesch – Middle Level Business Math; Amelia Hakl – Middle Level Career Exploration. Later in the afternoon, members attended the Mountain Plains Regional recognition ceremony. Welcome to the 2019-2020 school year. My name is Mrs. Rossmeier and I am the Guidance Counselor at Boyd County Schools. My "Counselors Corner" will hopefully help keep students and parents informed. Senior Parents: Your student has just entered their Senior year and believe it or not graduation is not far off! From now until May it will be a hectic time for you and your student. Many students are taking college classes this year and it is important that they keep up with the assignments. College admission applications will need to be made. All applications are on line at the college websites. Each Senior is allowed 2 college days in order to visit and check out the school or schools of their choice. These days are not recorded as absents. However, the administration needs to be informed of when the student will be gone by having a note from you, the parent. Students have to make-up their class work prior to taking their visits. Students also need to notify the admissions office of the college to set up a visitation. I would be more than happy to help set up the visitation. I encourage students to make campus visits and check things out.

Scholarship information has been made available to your student via their google account and the Boyd County School website. A great source of scholarships is at www.educationquest.org. It is the student's responsibility to take the time to fill out the applications. One of the most important tasks you can do for your Senior is to apply for financial aid by completing the FAFSA(Free Application for Federal Student Aid). This form will be available on-line Oct. Ist at www.fafsa.ed.gov and you may use your 2018 Income Tax information. This is an easy way to fill out the form but students must apply for a pin number which they will keep throughout their education. Please contact me if you need help or have any questions about financial aid. The sooner you complete the form the sooner you will find out what aid your student will receive for college. Financial aid at colleges sometimes run on a "first come first serve" basis. **Junior Parents:** Your student will be preparing for the State ACT test which will be taken April 7, 2020. I also will be encouraging them to think about their future plans. **Sophomore Parents:** Sophomores will be traveling to Wayne State College on October 15th for the Career Day. This is a great chance for students to explore at least three career fields that they signed up for last spring. **Freshmen Parents:** Freshmen are getting use to their high school classes and need to keep in mind that all courses and grades go on their transcript. The seventh grade careers class are and will be discussing and working on self image while investigating the

The seventh grade careers class are and will be discussing and working on self image while investigating the different careers that are available to them. The fifth and sixth grade career class are working on discovering what skills they possess and how important rules are in school and in the workplace.
