

The Legacy of MLK by Rachel Matthews This month, our country celebrated the life and legacy of Martin Luther King Jr. Proposed as a national holiday in 1983, celebrated first in 1986, and observed the third Monday of January, MLK Day is a reminder to all Americans of the influence King had on our country in the 50's and 60's; from his inspiring speeches and leadership of protests, boycotts, and marches, to his involvement in the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the outlawing of discrimination in business and public transactions, as well as the inaction of the Voting Rights Act of 1965. His influence was prominent, leading to his nomination and achievement of the Nobel Prize for Peace in 1964. His work wasn't accepted by all. Opposition to peaceful protests, as well as his own personal abuse, was all too common. His home was bombed, he was arrested, beaten, and worn until the end, when he was assassinated on his hotel room balcony on April 4, 1968. But his legacy remains. He was, and continues to be, one of the most influential figures of the civil rights movement.

"We've got some difficult days ahead. But it doesn't matter with me now. Because I've been to the mountaintop....I just want to do God's will. And He's allowed me to go up to the mountain. And I've looked over. And I've seen the promised land. I may not get there with you. But I want you to know tonight, that we, as a people, will get to the promised land." -Martin Luther King Jr. (I've Been to the Mountaintop)
